Unit Crest



The Battalion colors for the 225th Forward Support Battalion were officially authorized by the United States Institute of Heraldry on 1 October 1991. Buff and Scarlet, colors traditionally associated with support organizations, were the primary colors of the flag. Embroidered on the flag was the unit coat of arms and crest. The coat of arms was a buff shield with 2 black keys adorned and intertwined over gold and scarlet-handled crossed sabers. The key represented the mission of sustaining the forces in battle to the front and rear. The crossed sabers represented the force in battle and the individual soldier. The colors of the coat of arms were black for strength and security, and gold for excellence. The crest for the Battalion was red oriental demidragon gule holding service in Vietnam and his spear symbolized combat. The colors of the crest were red for courage and sacrifice, and gold for excellence. Embroidered on the scroll of the colors was the Battalion's motto, "Warrior Support."
