



USAG-HI ODR WAQ Programs

- **All buses leave/return from/to Sgt Smith Theater**
(Trans coordinated by ODR after rosters are submitted)
- **Paintball Courses**
Activity with Paintball Hawaii.
Dress: must wear closed-toed shoes, long pants, and shirt.
- **Ocean Adventures**
Ocean-based activities, to include Discover SCUBA diving, Sea Kayaking, and Stand-Up Paddle Boarding.
Dress: appropriate beach attire, sunscreen.
- **High-Ropes Adventure Course**
Course through Camp Erdman YMCA, includes Low (team building) and High Ropes challenge courses.
Dress: must wear closed-toed shoes, long pants (ACU pants best with wearing a harness), and shirt.



Unit Responsibilities


- Coordinate with SB ODR to schedule WAQ activities. Available dates will be provided by ODR; dates and activities are based on contractor availability. Rosters to be provided NLT 10 working days prior to activity.
- Ensure that Soldiers are pre-briefed prior to the morning of, (Activity, correct attire, etc) and are strongly encouraged to eat breakfast that morning.
- Ensure that Soldiers are at Sgt Smith Theater NLT 0715 day of activity. Buses leave on time and POV trans is not allowed.
- Groups must be organized in platoon-sized, min 20, max ~30 persons per group. Provide one NCOIC per platoon.
- Ensure that each platoon sized element that is in a reset stage is scheduled to attend WAQ 1x.
- Schedule one NCO per activity/platoon to attend LLADD training at ODR prior to activity date. (Trainings normally held 2x month on Thursday 1500-1700 hrs)




