SUBJECT: USAG-HI Environmental Policy

1. References.

a. Executive Order 13148 – Greening the Government through Leadership in Environmental Management, 22 April 2000.

b. Memorandum from the Assistant Chief of Staff for Installation Management, Department of the Army, Subject: New installation Management Requirements, 6 August 2001.

2. Purpose. To provide a formal, written environmental policy statement that will also facilitate the incorporation of elements of the International Organization for Standardization (ISO) 14001 Environmental Management System (EMS) into the existing installation management structure.

3. Scope. This policy applies to all USAG-HI directorates, active duty and reserve components, tenant activities and agencies, and off-post units/agencies utilizing USAG-HI facilities.

4. General. The mission of the United States Army Garrison, Hawaii (USAG-HI) is to support troop unit readiness. USAG-HI will perform this mission in concert with our stewardship responsibility to protect and conserve the environment by striving to attain environmentally sustainable garrison as defined by the USAG-HI Strategic Plan. In accomplishing our mission, we commit to:

a. Complying with all applicable environmental pollution abatement policy, laws and regulations in our industrial areas.

b. Improving our environmental stewardship of our training areas.

c. Striving to fully integrate relevant environmental requirements into our standard work practices and procedures so environmental awareness and compliance are a routine part of the way we conduct business. In doing so, we will:

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
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(1) Continually assess activities, products and services to determine their effect on the environment. Identify significant environmental impacts and insure that they are considered when establishing goals and objectives in our short-term and long-term strategic planning.

(2) Identify potential sources of pollution and meet or exceed Army goals for prevention of pollution.

d. Being sensitive to those unique environmental and community values that make Hawaii a special place to live, work, and train.

5. This policy will be given widest dissemination. Copies of the policy will be posted in shops, work areas, unit bulletin, and on all official bulletin boards as appropriate. This policy will be available on the 25th Infantry Division (Light) intranet and to the public upon request.
