



# Steps to Registering Your POV

Steps In Order:

- 1) Obtain Valid Hawaii POV Insurance
- 2) Hawaii State Safety Check
- 3) Non-Resident Certificate Form CSL50
- 4) Register POV



# Hawaii POV Insurance

- Hawaii is a “No Fault State” and has special POV insurance requirements
- Contact your insurer before you arrive and make sure:
  - Your policy will be valid in Hawaii
  - Your insurance card meets Hawaii’s requirements
- Your proof of insurance must meet Hawaii’s requirements prior to completing the registration process.



# Safety Check

(1of3)

- Hawaii requires initial and annual POV safety checks.
- Most auto repair shops and the post auto shop conduct these safety checks.
- Cost is 15.50 + tax.



# Safety Check

(2of3)

- Initial Inspection
  - You'll get a BLUE "Pending Registration" certificate
  - Take this to the DMV
  - After registering at the DMV, come back to the inspection station and get your PINK and YELLOW copies. These will be good for 1 year.



# Safety Check

(3of3)

- Common Friction Points

- Not having valid Hawaii proof of insurance
- Not having current registration
  - Out of State is OK for initial check
- Excessive window tint

# Non-Resident Certificate


Form DSL 50

- S-1 may require your POV's registration and proof of insurance
- S-1 may require you to be in uniform
- S-1 signs form
- Saves \$\$\$



# DMV Registration (1 of 4)

- Closest DMV
  - 330 N. Cane St, Wahiawa, HI
  - Collocated with Police Station





# DMV Registration

(2of4)

- Take following with you:
  - Proof of Hawaii POV Insurance
  - Safety Inspection (Blue Copy)
  - Current Registration
  - Bill of Lading or Shipping Receipt
  - Form CSL 50
  - Cash or Check. Credit cards are NOT accepted.



# DMV Registration

(3of4)

- You must register your POV within 10 days of arrival or face potential fines.
- You may choose 1 of 2 options:
  - Out of State Permit
  - Hawaii License Plates



# DMV Registration

(4of4)

- Out of State Permit (\$5)
  - Keep your current out of state plates until they expire.
  - Blue sticker for your bumper.
  - Good option if your current plates won't expire for a few months.
- Hawaii Plates (\$25.50)
  - May be more convenient if your current plates will expire soon.
